- 2. The subject matter of the proposed rule:**  
H.B. 2415 passed in the 2000 Legislative session. The bill establishes a new section, A.R.S. § 32-1970, that allows a pharmacist to participate in collaborative drug therapy management with a physician. H.B. 2415 mandates that the Board make rules approved by the Allopathic Board of Medical Examiners and the Board of Osteopathic Examiners in Medicine and Surgery to implement section § 32-1970. The proposed rule will fulfill that mandate by establishing specific requirements and standards for the expansion of pharmacist practice into drug therapy management and collaborative practice.

### NOTICE OF RULEMAKING DOCKET OPENING

#### DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY - WATER POLLUTION CONTROL

**2. The subject matter of the proposed rule:**

Pursuant to A.R.S. § 49-203(A)(6), the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) expects to propose rules that will simplify the current wastewater reuse permit program. The revised permit program for direct reuse of reclaimed water will rely to the maximum extent practicable on general permits that are issued to the end users of reclaimed water. ADEQ expects the new rules to clarify both the interface between the current Aquifer Protection Permit and the reclaimed water permit programs as well as ADEQ's enforcement authority for violations of reclaimed water reuse regulations.

ADEQ also intends to add a new Article to establish technical standards for conveyances of reclaimed water to satisfy the remainder of A.R.S. § 49-203(A)(6). Current regulation of conveyances for reclaimed water, including both pipeline and open channel conveyances, spans several rules that are in the process of being rescinded or revised. This rulemaking complements ADEQ's efforts to eliminate duplicative regulation under multiple water quality programs and to streamline the remaining programs. The result is a single, simple rule that specifies technical standards for design and operation of reclaimed water conveyances.

A Notice of Docket Opening was previously published regarding this rulemaking at 5 A.A.R. 2112. The Department has since determined that it will also add Article 6 to this rulemaking which will contain technical standards for conveyance of reclaimed water.
