2. Subject matter of the proposed rules:

Section numbers:

A number of changes are being made as part of a five-year review that was completed in January 2002. The majority of changes are made to keep Arizona rules current with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) and Conference of Radiation Control Program Directors (CRCPD) Suggested State Standards.

In R12-1-319 the Agency may terminate a radioactive material license provided the licensee has met the termination criteria in Article 4. In Article 7 many changes are made for clarification purposes and to update incorporated references. Of special interest is the regulatory relief offered to medical licensees by changes in R12-1-706, R12-1-712, and R12-1-713. These changes follow similar changes in NRC standards that go into effect in October 2002. R12-1-706 will allow small hospitals to not have a radiation safety committee IRSC). The RSC oversees the radiation safety program which is administered by the radiation safety officer (RSO). R12-1-712 will no longer require quarterly inventories of sealed sources. However, a six month inventory will be required, as is required of industrial users of sealed sources. R12-1-713 will not require medical licensees serviced by a radiopharmaceutical supplier to use a dose calibrator. Article 8 has undergone a major review and subsequent revision, based on a comparison to the standards in CRCPD Suggested State Regulations. Also, some of the rules in this Article contain awkward formatting, requiring much needed revision. The title to Article 10 has, for some time, implied that the rules it contains, affects nonionizing radiation users as well as the intended group, ionizing radiation users. This confusion was created when the nonionizing radiation regulations were added after the rules in Article 10 had been in effect for a number of years.
