# 6. An explanation of the rule, including the agency's reasons for initiating the rule, including the statutory citation to the exemption from the regular rulemaking procedures:

R12-8-109, Fees and Permits set the fees for visitor use and commercial use at Arizona State Parks. Each year, the Arizona State Parks Board reviews its fee structure and approves adjustments for the ensuring calendar year. In its analysis, Arizona State Parks reviews fee structures of surrounding states; reviews operating and development costs of the State Park System; reviews the public demand for park services and subsequent impacts of visitor use on park

resources. State Parks actively pursues public input into the fee structure through regional meetings throughout the State.

Since March 1, 2004, Arizona State Parks has taken additional public comment, and held staff reviews of the agency's Annual Pass program. Administrative and usage descriptions for the current pass program has been developed. These changes are less restrictive, and there is no change to the actual fee for either pass. Additional discussions with the Arizona State Parks Board Chairman have been held and approval to implement these changes has been obtained.
