With the exception of egregious errors, content (including spelling, grammar, and punctuation) of these orders has been reproduced as submitted.

**EXECUTIVE ORDER 2004-18
(AMENDS AND SUPERSEDES EXECUTIVE ORDERS 2001-09 AND 2001-13)
THE GOVERNOR'S TRAFFIC SAFETY ADVISORY COUNCIL**

WHEREAS, traffic and motor vehicle crashes cause numerous personal injuries and fatalities, as well as extensive economic costs; and

WHEREAS, improving traffic safety must involve the "4 Es": engineering; enforcement; education; and emergency response; and

WHEREAS, the public is highly interested in highway and traffic safety issues and in the need to develop more effective to develop more effective strategies to reduce the number of lives lost, the human suffering, and the economic costs associated with motor vehicle crashes in Arizona;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Janet Napolitano, Governor of the State of Arizona, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Arizona Constitution and the laws of the State, do hereby amend and continue the Governor's Traffic Safety Advisory Council (the "Council") and amend the Executive Orders relating to it as follows:

1. The Council shall consist of the following members who shall be appointed by, and serve at the pleasure of, the Governor:
 - (a) The directors of the Governor's Office of Highway Safety ("GOHS"), the Arizona Department of Transportation ("ADOT"), and the Department of Public Safety ("DPS") shall serve as co-chairs for the Council. These directors may establish committees to deal with specific traffic safety issues and they may designate staff within their respective agencies to assist with our serve on the committees.
 - (b) The Council shall include one representative from each of the following organizations or governmental entities:
 - AAA of Arizona
 - Arizona Driver and Safety Education Association
 - Arizona County Sheriff's Association
 - Arizona Police Chiefs Association
 - Arizona Safe Kids Coalition
 - Mothers Against Drunk Drivers (MADD)
 - Students Against Destructive Decisions (SADD)
 - Inter-Tribal Council of Arizona (ITCA)
 - National Safety Council
 - Professional Fire Fighters of Arizona
 - Two regional planning agencies
 - (c) In addition, the Council may, at the discretion of the Governor, include the division administrators from the Federal Highway Administration, Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration, and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.
 - (d) The Chairs of the Transportation Committees of the Arizona State House of Representatives and the Arizona State

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Senate may be invited to participate and speak to the Council as invited by the Co-Chairs.

2. Members of the Council may send alternatives to represent them at Advisory Council meetings.
3. The Council shall have an executive committee made up of the directors of the Governor's Office of Highway Safety (GOHS), the Department of Transportation (ADOT), and the Department of Public Safety (DPS). In addition, the division administrators of the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) may, at the discretion of the Governor, serve on the executive committee.
4. The executive committee shall make initial recommendations to the Council for the Council's approval on the following topics:
 - (a) Developing strategies for improving traffic safety on our federal, state, county and local roads through better engineering, enforcement, education, and emergency response.
 - (b) Identifying "best practices" for improving traffic safety, including but not limited to, programs or laws that have been proven effective to reduce the incidents of red light running and impaired driving and increase the use of occupant safety belt and child restraints.
 - (c) Recommending specific traffic safety legislation for possible consideration by the Arizona Legislature.
 - (d) Reviewing and recommending specific educational material that could be incorporated into existing or new driver training and high school driver education classes or courses.
 - (e) Analyzing current state and federal laws and programs governing motor carrier safety and recommend any changes that would enhance the effectiveness of these laws or programs.
 - (f) Establishing a matrix of indicators that objectively measure and report our state's progress in reducing serious injuries and fatalities due to vehicular crashes on state and local roads.
5. The Council shall submit its recommendations to the Governor, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the Arizona House of Representatives by December 31 of each year.

EXECUTIVE ORDER 2004-19

**ESTABLISHMENT OF AN ARIZONA GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION COUNCIL
(SUPERSEDES EXECUTIVE ORDERS 89-24, 92-17 AND 2003-01)**

WHEREAS, a broad based effort, commitment, policy direction and framework is needed for Arizona to develop and manage its geographic information resources; and

WHEREAS, the Arizona State Land Department is charged with establishing a clearinghouse of information and central repository for maps, imagery products and digital cartographic data pursuant to A.R.S. § 37-173(1); and

WHEREAS, the Arizona State Land Department provides a geographic information system for public agencies in Arizona pursuant to A.R.S. § 37-173(2); and

WHEREAS, the Arizona State Land Department prepares standards and specifications for developing and producing cartographic products, aerial photographic products and geographic information systems pursuant to A.R.S. § 37-173(4); and

WHEREAS, the Arizona Geographic Information Council ("AGIC") was originally established by Executive Order 89-24 to coordinate the management of statewide geographic information and serve as an advisory council to the Arizona State Land Department to provide guidance and direction to the management of the State Geographic Information System; and

WHEREAS, the composition and membership of AGIC needs to be expanded to include regional geographic information systems consortia and the duties of AGIC need to be confirmed;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Janet Napolitano, Governor of the State of Arizona, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and Laws of this State, hereby order as follows:

1. The composition and membership of AGIC shall be as follows:
 - a. AGIC shall be composed of an Executive Management Board and standing technical committees to advise the Board on technical issues related to mapping and geographic information systems and to assist the Board in the implementation of AGIC programs.
 - b. Members of the Executive Management Board shall be appointed by the Governor, serve at the pleasure of the Governor, and consist of one voting representative from each of the following:

- c. Members of the Executive Management board shall elect from among the representatives a president, vice-president and secretary.
 - d. The members of the Standing Technical Committees shall be appointed by the Executive Management Board as deemed necessary.
 - e. Members of the AGIC Executive Management Board, or their designees, shall meet at the call of the President, adopt by-laws, rules and procedures for the orderly conduct of operations, and conduct the duties of AGIC.
 - f. Members shall not receive additional beyond their existing salaries as public employees.
2. The duties of AGIC shall be as follows:
- a. AGIC shall collect information on user requirements for maps, imagery products and geographic information systems.
 - b. AGIC shall prioritize and relate such requirements to the U.S. Geological Survey, the Arizona Land Resource Information System and other producers of geographic information and cartographic products.
 - c. AGIC shall serve as a forum to share information about Federal, State, and local government and private sector map production and geographic information system activities.
 - d. AGIC shall participate in activities to define those categories of spatial data appropriate for standardization and establish standards of content, format and accuracy for the identified data categories.
 - e. AGIC shall coordinate interagency map production or acquisition and geographic data base development.
 - f. AGIC shall study cartographic and geographic information systems and make recommendations to responsible entities.

EXECUTIVE ORDER 2004-20

**ESTABLISHING THE GOVERNOR'S
ARIZONA TEACHER'S EXCELLENCE PROGRAM (AZTEP) COORDINATION COUNCIL**

WHEREAS, the State of Arizona's underserved areas on Indian reservations and Enterprise Communities lack sufficient quantities of highly qualified teachers; and

WHEREAS, the State of Arizona needs a plan to increase the pool of highly qualified teachers in Arizona's underserved communities; and

WHEREAS, grant funds are available from a variety of federal and private sources that could be administered pursuant to A.R.S. § 41-2701 for the purposes of recruiting and placing qualified teachers in Arizona's underserved communities and otherwise improving the quality of education in those areas;

NOW, THEREFORE, I Janet Napolitano, Governor of the State of Arizona, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of this state, hereby order and direct as follows:

1. The *Arizona Teacher's Excellence Program Coordination Council* (the "*AzTEP Council*") is created to solicit, review and approve grant applications and oversee the administration of grants to high-needs local education entities.
2. The *AzTEP Council* shall meet at least quarterly and be comprised of the following eleven (11) senior managers of education stakeholders, each of whom shall be appointed by the Governor, and serve, without compensation, at the pleasure of the Governor:
 - a. The Governor's Policy Advisor for Education
 - b. A representative of the Arizona Department of Education
 - c. A representative of the Arizona Education Association
 - d. A representative of the NAU-Arizona K-12 Center
 - e. A representative of the ASU Center for Indian Education
 - f. A member of the Tribal Education Committee
 - g. A representative of Arizona Indian Education Association
 - h. A representative of the Arizona School Board Association
 - i. A representative from the education Non-Profit community
 - j. A representative of the Arizona Business & Education Council
 - k. A representative of the State Board for Charter Schools
3. The *AzTEP Council* shall be chaired and staffed as determined by the Governor. The *AzTEP Council* shall designate from among its members and the Governor's staff a grant management team to manage grant applications and administration.
4. The *AzTEP Council* shall, among other things:
 - a. Monitor the Council's progress, through (at a minimum) biannual meetings in which the director and grant management team provide a report, and ensure that the objectives of each grant are being met;
 - b. Solicit, receive, evaluate, approve and award sub-grantee applications;
 - c. Provide recommendations for improvements to the grants and grant programs and;
 - d. Provide recommendations to foster success and sustainability in recruiting and retaining highly qualified teachers in high-need schools beyond the life of the grant.

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EXECUTIVE ORDER 2004-21

STATE LAND DEPARTMENT FORESTRY DIVISION

WHEREAS, A.R.S. § 37-621 establishes the positions of state forester and deputy state forester; and

WHEREAS, presently, the administrative, operational and management functions of the State Forester are housed within the State Land Department; and

WHEREAS, maintaining the administrative, operational and management functions of the State Forester as a formal Division of the State Land Department will allow maximum administrative and financial efficiency; and

WHEREAS, consolidating state forest management functions within the State Land Department under a Forestry Division will further leverage those efficiencies, ensure coordination of forest management activities within Arizona, and provide for coherent delivery of services required to reduce fire hazards and damage;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Janet Napolitano, Governor of the State of Arizona, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of this State, hereby order and direct as follows:

1. The administrative, operational and management functions of the State Forester shall continue to be housed within the State Land Department and shall become a formal Division of the State Land Department. The State Forester shall continue to utilize the resources of the State Land Department in performing his duties.

2. All state forest management functions shall be consolidated under the State Land Department's Forestry Division.

3. The State Forester shall submit his or her yearly budget request to the State Land Commissioner, who shall accept or modify the budget request and submit it to the Governor's Office of Strategic Planning and Budget as a part of the State Land Department's requested budget.

4. All money appropriated to the Forestry Division shall be used on equipment, personnel and activities directly related to Forestry Division responsibilities. The State Forester shall administer the Forestry Division budget, utilizing the administrative infrastructure of the State Land Department and subject to the oversight of the State Land Commissioner.

5. The State Forester shall report directly to the Governor on policy matters involving wildfire prevention, management and suppression.

EXECUTIVE ORDER 2004-22

ESTABLISHING A GOVERNOR'S ADVISORY COUNCIL ON AVIATION

WHEREAS, an efficient and reliable aviation system is a critical element of Arizona's overall transportation system and the vitality of our state's economy; and

WHEREAS, the aviation industry had a \$37 billion impact on Arizona's economy in 2002 and supported over 467,855 jobs with a payroll of \$14.6 billion; and

WHEREAS, air travelers and tourists spent \$5.9 billion in Arizona in 2002, creating over 121,000 jobs in lodging, retailing and the service sector; and

WHEREAS, over the next 20 years the total number of passengers boarding at all twelve commercial service airports in the State -- including the three largest airports, Sky Harbor International, Tucson International and the Grand Canyon National Park Airport -- is expected to nearly double; and

WHEREAS, the total number of general aviation aircraft based in Arizona is expected to increase by more than 30 percent over the next 20 years; and

WHEREAS, the amount of cargo passing through Sky Harbor International and Tucson International and other major airport facilities throughout Arizona is expected to more than double over the next 20 years; and

WHEREAS, there is a great need to increase the communication and coordination between state and local entities with federal agencies that regulate airspace and other aspects of aviation in our state; and

WHEREAS, there is a distinct need to improve coordination and the compatibility between community land use planning and airport development and utilization; and

WHEREAS, there is a clear need to identify funding sources and funding strategies for enhancing aviation throughout the state;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Janet Napolitano, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Governor by the Arizona Constitution and the laws of the State, do hereby establish the **Governor's Advisory Council on Aviation ("ACA" or the "Council")** to develop strategies for improving the efficiency of Arizona's aviation system, enhance land use and aviation planning, and improve the working relationship and communication between state and local aviation entities and relevant federal agencies.

1. The members of the Council shall be appointed by the Governor and will serve at the pleasure of the Governor for up to four years.
 - a. The Council membership will include a chairperson to be named by the Governor.
 - b. The Council will include the Director of the Arizona Department of Transportation or designee and at least ten at-large members with expertise or experience in aviation. At-large members shall not advocate for or represent any special or corporate interest when performing their duties on the Council. The Advisory Council, during the course of its deliberations, should take testimony from all aviation interests including corporations, aviation businesses, the military, and the general public.
 - c. The Governor may appoint representatives from other state, regional or federal agencies, such as the Federal Aviation Administration and the U.S. Department of Defense, to serve as Ex-Officio members of the Advisory Council.
 - d. The Arizona Department of Transportation shall serve as staff to the Council.
2. The Council, in consultation with state, regional and local transportation entities, shall establish mechanisms or procedures for improving the communication, dialogue and working relations with federal agencies that have jurisdiction over aviation issues in Arizona.
3. The Advisory Council shall work with the State Transportation Board and other appropriate aviation officials to

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establish a process for defining future aviation needs and a strategy for addressing these needs.

4. The Advisory Council shall study and issue "consensus" findings and recommendations that specifically address the following issues:
 - a. Airspace utilization and airport capacity
 - b. Land use compatibility
 - c. Federal funding for aviation in Arizona
 - d. Criteria for evaluating aviation facility and system needs
 - e. Future aviation needs assessments and funding strategies

5. The Council shall issue a preliminary report twelve months from the Council's first session and a final report twenty-four months from the Council's first session. The report shall be distributed to the Governor, the President of the Arizona State Senate and the Speaker of the Arizona House of Representatives.

EXECUTIVE ORDER 2004-24

(SUPERSEDES EXECUTIVE ORDERS 95-13 AND 91-1)

DESIGNATING THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF HIGHWAY SAFETY AS THE STATE HIGHWAY SAFETY AGENCY, AND AS SUCH, THE APPROPRIATE AGENCY TO ADMINISTER THE HIGHWAY SAFETY ACT OF 1966 ON BEHALF OF THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, A.R.S. § 28-611 authorizes and directs the Governor to do all things necessary on behalf of the State to secure the full benefits of the Federal Highway Safety Act of 1966 (the Act), Public Law 89-564, 80 Stat. 731; and

WHEREAS, A.R.S. § 28-611 further designates the Governor as the officer responsible for the highway safety programs pursuant to the Act and authorizes her to administer the highway safety programs of the State and its political subdivisions; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to designate an organization and delegate thereto certain of the Governor's powers and authority for the execution of such highway safety programs,

NOW THEREFORE, I, Janet Napolitano, Governor of the State of Arizona, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and Laws of this State, hereby order as follows:

1. There is hereby established in the Executive Branch of the State government, a **Governor's Highway Safety Director** who shall be appointed by and shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor, and be supported by employees of the State of Arizona.

2. The Governor's Highway Safety Director is hereby vested with all the powers and authority vested in the Governor pursuant to A.R.S. § 28-611. The Director is directed to exercise such powers in the best interests of the State and in accordance with the Act.

3. All departments and agencies within the Executive Branch of State government are to cooperate with the Governor's Highway Safety Director in the performance of highway safety functions provided herein.

4. The Governor's Office of Highway Safety and all present employees shall continue to function as staff to the Director, who shall have responsibility for the direction, operation and control of the office.

5. The Arizona Department of Public Safety shall coordinate with and assist the Governor's Office of Highway Safety as needed to protect the public and comply with the Acts.

6. The Governor's Highway Safety Director shall report directly to the Governor or her designee and shall be directly responsible to the Governor for the conduct and the administration of the Governor's Office of Highway Safety.

7. The Federal Highway Safety Fund identified as "Fund 64100" shall be under the control of the Governor's Office of Highway Safety in the execution of its duties.

8. Pursuant to 23 CFR § 1251.2, the Governor's Office of Highway Safety is designated as the State Highway Safety Agency.

EXECUTIVE ORDER 2004-25

ESTABLISHING THE ARIZONA COMMISSION ON MEDICAL EDUCATION AND RESEARCH

WHEREAS, the delivery of health care is critical to the quality of life of all Arizonans; and

WHEREAS, we stand on the edge of a new age in medical research and the treatment of disease; and

WHEREAS, the State of Arizona has committed resources and leadership to the development of world class bio-medical education and research; and

WHEREAS, the Arizona Board of Regents, the University of Arizona and Arizona State University have signed a Memorandum of Understanding to partner in the expansion of the University of Arizona's College of Medicine in Maricopa County; and

WHEREAS, the success of the medical school and the bio-medical research efforts will be directly tied to relationships and affiliation agreements with the community's health care delivery system; and

WHEREAS, it is imperative that medical education, research and health care delivery systems in this state develop a shared vision for the future of healthcare education;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Janet Napolitano, Governor of the State of Arizona, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of the State, do hereby establish the Arizona Commission on Medical Education and Research ("ACMER" or "Commission").

1. The Commission is charged with developing a plan to implement the principles outlined in the August 4, 2004 Memorandum Of Understanding regarding the "Expansion of Medical Education and Research in Phoenix" adopted by the Arizona Board of Regents, Arizona State University, and the University of Arizona. Specific areas of planning, design and development include:
 - A. The organization and governance structure of the expansion;
 - B. A curriculum that focuses on the unique social, cultural, and health care system needs in the Phoenix metropolitan region;
 - C. The essential clinical linkages among regional teaching hospitals and research institutes to facilitate teaching of students and research collaboration;
 - D. The financing of operations and capital needs;
 - E. Facility planning, location and design; and
 - F. Such other matters as may be in the best interest of comprehensive, but cost effective, delivery of health care in the state of Arizona.
2. Members of the Council shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Governor. Initial Commission membership shall consist of the following:

Gary Stuart, President of the Arizona Board of Regents
Peter Likins, President of the University of Arizona
Michael Crow, President of Arizona State University

Linda Hunt, Chief Executive Officer of St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center
Jim Kennedy, Chief Medical Officer, Maricopa County Hospital
Jeffrey Trent, President and Scientific Director of the Translational Genomics Research Institute
John Murphy, Executive Director, the Flinn Foundation

The Governor may appoint other members as may be necessary.

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3. The Commission shall issue its initial recommendations to the Governor as early as possible, but by no later than March 30, 2005.

EXECUTIVE ORDER 2004-26

TO SPEND MONEY FROM THE HEALTH CRISIS FUND ON THE PREVENTION OF INFLUENZA

WHEREAS, pursuant to A.R.S. § 36-797, the Legislature has established the Health Crisis Fund empowering the Governor to authorize specific liabilities and expenditures in order to respond to a health crisis or a significant potential for a health crisis; and

WHEREAS, influenza is a potentially lethal disease that causes illnesses and fatalities in Arizona every year; and

WHEREAS, there is a significant shortage of influenza vaccine available in Arizona this year due to manufacturing problems; and

WHEREAS, the shortage of influenza vaccine creates a significant potential that Arizona will experience increased illnesses and fatalities during FY 2005; and

WHEREAS, the public health threat posed by influenza can be reduced by quickly purchasing vaccine that becomes available and increasing public awareness of methods to slow the spread of influenza; and

WHEREAS, the Arizona Department of Health Services has an opportunity to purchase 22,500 additional influenza vaccines; and

WHEREAS, these circumstances are neither a contingency nor an emergency pursuant to A.R.S. § 35-192 because they require neither state-municipal resource coordination nor Department of Military Affairs assistance;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Janet Napolitano, Governor of the State of Arizona, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Arizona Constitution and the laws of the State, declare a significant potential for a health crisis in this State and hereby order as follows:

1. The Health Crisis Fund, as established pursuant to A.R.S. § 36-797, is authorized to transfer the sum of two hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000.00) to the Department of Health Services for use in responding to the influenza vaccine shortage crisis.
2. The Department of Health Services shall expend all moneys transferred pursuant to this Order on measures to reduce the spread and threat to public health posed by influenza in Arizona and shall report to the Legislature and the Governor by December 31, 2005 on the expenditure of all sums so transferred.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2004-27

ADOPTION OF THE ARIZONA MULTI-HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN

WHEREAS, A.R.S. §§ 26-301 through 26-318 assign certain responsibilities and authorities for disaster preparedness, response, recovery and mitigation; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with A.R.S. § 26-305, there is established within the Department of Emergency and Military Affairs the Division of Emergency Management, which is administered by the Department under the authority of the Adjutant General, subject to powers vested in the Governor as provided by law; and

WHEREAS, the Adjutant General has delegated to the Director of the Arizona Division of Emergency Management the responsibility to prepare for and coordinate those emergency management activities that may be required to reduce the impact of disasters on persons or property; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with this responsibility, the Director of the Arizona Division of Emergency Management, in coordination with the State Hazard Mitigation Committee, has developed the State Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Plan identifies hazards that threaten Arizona's citizens and property, and identifies and prioritizes projects to reduce or eliminate the threats; and,

WHEREAS, the State of Arizona must adopt a State Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan compliant with the federal Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 to be eligible for certain disaster assistance funding;

NOW, THEREFORE I, Janet Napolitano, Governor of the State of Arizona, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of the State, do hereby order the adoption of and adherence to the State Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan, and direct the following:

1. The Director of the Arizona Division of Emergency Management shall maintain and update this plan periodically, but no less than once every three years.
2. The Director of the Arizona Division of Emergency Management shall implement the plan to reduce or eliminate threats to Arizona's citizens and property.
3. State agencies serving on the State Hazard Mitigation Committee shall participate in an annual review and update of the plan.
4. All state agencies shall support the implementation of the plan.

EXECUTIVE ORDER 2004-28

IMPLEMENTATION OF STATEWIDE 5% WATER USE REDUCTION PLAN

WHEREAS, Arizona makes up a significant portion of the Sonoran desert and must always be careful and pragmatic in its water consumption; and

WHEREAS, Arizona has experienced a prolonged, multi-year drought that has strained its limited water resources; and

WHEREAS, the State of Arizona must set the example for all Arizonans in the area of water conservation; and

WHEREAS, technologies exist that enable the State to efficiently reduce its water consumption;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Janet Napolitano, Governor of the State of Arizona, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Governor by the Arizona Constitution and the laws of this State, do hereby order as follows:

1. All agencies of the Executive Branch of state government shall immediately take steps necessary to reduce annual water consumption by five percent (5%), using FY 04 consumption levels as a baseline.
2. All agencies of the Executive Branch of state government shall appoint a Water Efficiency Coordinator to:
 - a. implement a water accounting system to determine the amount of water used for all end users in the agency's buildings or facilities;
 - b. develop a Rapid Response Repair Method to promptly fix any leaks;
 - c. educate agency employees on water conservation; and
 - d. immediately implement no-cost or low-cost measures to save water in the agency's buildings or facilities.
3. No agency within the Executive Branch of state government shall plant or water winter grasses without the expressed written consent of the Governor's Office.
4. All agencies of the Executive Branch of state government shall comply with the provisions of HB 2276 with regard to the installation of Water Free Urinals.
5. All agencies of the Executive Branch of state government shall report to me on or before June 30, 2005, and annually thereafter, on their water conservation efforts pursuant to this Executive Order.
