On May 13, 2005, the Department filed a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking with the Secretary of State's office. The Proposed Rule is intended to conform Arizona's Medicare Supplement rules with the Medicare Prescription Drug, Improvement and Modernization Act (MMA), enacted by Congress in 2003. Under the MMA, all Medicare Supplement insurance polices issued on or after January 1, 2006, must conform to the MMA requirements pertaining to Medicare Supplement insurance. The Department requested the rulemaking become effective upon filing with the Secretary of State's office and anticipates an effective date well before January 1, 2006. The purpose of this Bulletin is to notify insurers and other interested parties that, until the Proposed Rule becomes effective in its final form, the Department will refer to the Proposed Rule when considering Medicare Supplement forms and advertising materials submitted for approval before use.
