In addition, the *Register* shall include each statement filed by the Governor in granting a commutation, pardon or reprieve, or stay or suspension of execution where a sentence of death is imposed. With the exception of egregious errors, content (including spelling, grammar, and punctuation) of these orders has been reproduced as submitted.

**WHEREAS,** as America's storyteller, Henry Wadsworth Longfellow helped to create America's national identity through his portrayals of historic events and characters, as in "Paul Revere's Ride," "Hiawatha," "Evangeline," and "The Courtship of Miles Standish"; and

**WHEREAS,** as the poet of the people, Longfellow was the most widely read poet in the English-speaking world for more than 100 years, memorized by citizens from all walks of life. Generations of children learned to enjoy poetry through Long-fellow's carefully composed verse; and

**WHEREAS,** as a citizen of the world, Longfellow, a professor of modern languages at Bowdoin and Harvard, introduced Americans to the literature of the world, producing the first American translation of, among other works, Dante's Divine Comedy. Longfellow was the first American memorialized by a bust in Poet's Corner in London's Westminster Abbey; and

**WHEREAS**, as a multiculturalists, Longfellow championed multiculturalism before that term was invented, writing sympathetically about ethnic and religious minorities and combining stories and forms from many literary traditions; and

WHEREAS, as an author of lasting influence, hundreds of libraries, schools, and other public places in the United States are named for Longfellow; and

**WHEREAS**, February 27, 2007 marks the 200th birthday of Mr. Longfellow and the national focus of the public school based "Longfellow Across America" program—an organized reading of Longfellow's poetry designed to increase the visibility and enjoyment of his work and to foster greater appreciation of his role in helping to shape America's culture; and

**WHEREAS,** Paul Litchfield, representing Goodyear, came to Arizona from Akron, Ohio, in 1916 and found the climate to be perfectly suited to growing the long-staple cotton needed for producing pneumatic tires. He negotiated the purchase of 14,000 acres of land to plant cotton and by the fall of 1917, the farm had already produced 1,500 bales of cotton; and

**WHEREAS,** Litchfield Park became the headquarters of the Goodyear Farms operation in Arizona, which was active for over fifty years with a variety of uses for the land besides growing cotton including grain for cattle; and

**WHEREAS**, Litchfield Park also became a "laboratory on wheels" for testing the pneumatic tire on every type of farm equipment and proved to double the accomplishments of farm operators while also testing automobile, truck and bus tires; and

WHEREAS, in 1918, the downtown area of Litchfield Park was planned and streets were laid out, trees were planted and the first buildings were erected; and

**WHEREAS**, the quality of life that Paul Litchfield and Goodyear brought to the area is still visible today in the strong sense of community, the quality of the schools, homes, lifestyle and especially the prestigious Wigwam Golf Resort and Spa;
