- 2. The subject matter of the proposed rule:** The purpose of this rulemaking is to address the issues identified in the previous five-year-review report approved by the Governor's Regulatory Review Council. The subject matter of R2-10-501 establishes the conditions under which Risk Management will open a claim and provide funding to state agencies for the investigation and remediation of environmental damage to property under the ownership or control of the state. The subject matter of R2-10-502 establishes the selection procedure for the contracting of environmental investigation and remediation. The rule establishes the role of Risk Management in the selection and justification of hiring an environmental contractor. The

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subject matter of R2-10-503 provides state agencies with the option of requesting funding from Risk Management for site maintenance of closed hazardous substance/waste sites. The subject matter of R2-10-504 provides agencies with the option of requesting training funded by Risk Management on environmental hazard identification and prevention topics to their personnel. The proposed rules shall amend language to clarify definitions and align rules to be consistent with environmental terminology. In addition, the proposed rulemaking will amend language to clarify acceptable environmental property and liability claims.
