**EXECUTIVE ORDERS, PROCLAMATIONS OF
GENERAL APPLICABILITY, AND STATEMENTS
ISSUED BY THE GOVERNOR
PURSUANT TO A.R.S. § 41-1013(B)(3)**

The Administrative Procedure Act (APA) requires the full-text publication of all Executive Orders and Proclamations of General Applicability issued by the Governor. In addition, the *Register* shall include each statement filed by the Governor in granting a commutation, pardon or reprieve, or stay or suspension of execution where a sentence of death is imposed. With the exception of egregious errors, content (including spelling, grammar, and punctuation) of these orders has been reproduced as submitted.

*** WORLD AIDS DAY ***

WHEREAS, HIV/AIDS is a global health crisis and a constant struggle for many of our families, friends, and neighbors. On World AIDS Day, we underscore our commitment to fight the AIDS pandemic with compassion and decisive action; and

WHEREAS, as the global community observes World AIDS day, we remember friends, loved ones, neighbors and colleagues who have lost their lives to AIDS, and we reaffirm our commitment to defeat this devastating disease; and

WHEREAS, nearly 11,000 people live with HIV/AIDS in Arizona with over 7,000 living in Phoenix and surrounding areas; 1 million, two hundred thousand live with HIV/AIDS nationwide; and, 38 million, six hundred thousand people live with the virus globally; and

WHEREAS, the global epidemic of HIV infection and AIDS requires a worldwide effort to stop the spread of HIV and AIDS which together pose one of the largest, most complex threats to human health the world has even known; and

WHEREAS, The Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS) has designated an independent organization, World AIDS Campaign, to oversee and united global efforts around World AIDS Day through a worldwide campaign on December first of each year; and

WHEREAS, World AIDS Day 2007 provides an opportunity to fight against AIDS and highlight continued efforts in the delivery of HIV prevention programs, services and care; and

WHEREAS, in recognition that we will triumph over the tragedy of HIV/AIDS by scientific research and effective HIV prevention, people are encouraged to ensure they are informed and educated about the risks of HIV;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Janet Napolitano, Governor of the State of Arizona do hereby proclaim December 1, 2007 as

in Arizona.
