Requirements and procedures for birth certificates for individuals who are born and death certificates for individuals who die in the state of Arizona are contained in 9 A.A.C. 19. In this rulemaking the Department will amend and add definitions in Article 1 pertinent to birth records; amend Article 2, which contains requirements and procedures for vital records concerning birth, birth certificates, and amending a registered birth certificate; and amend one subsection in Article 3 to reflect a definition amendment, consistent with current statutory authority, Department policies, and industry standards.
