PURSUANT TO A.R.S. § 41-1013(B)(3)**

The Administrative Procedure Act (APA) requires the full-text publication of all Executive Orders and Proclamations of General Applicability issued by the Governor. In addition, the *Register* shall include each statement filed by the Governor in granting a commutation, pardon or reprieve, or stay or suspension of execution where a sentence of death is imposed. With the exception of egregious errors, content (including spelling, grammar, and punctuation) of these orders has been reproduced as submitted.

*** IWO JIMA 65TH ANNIVERSARY COMMEMORATION ***

WHEREAS, on February 19, 1945, more than 110,000 Americans with 880 ships landed on the small volcanic island of Iwo Jima in the Pacific; and

WHEREAS, for the next four days some of the bloodiest and most fierce combat during World War II ensued; and

WHEREAS, in 36 days of fighting to secure the island, more than 6,800 United States Marines paid the ultimate sacrifice and more than 21,000 Japanese perished; and

WHEREAS, on the morning of February 23, 1945, a United States Marine Corps patrol climbed Mount Suribachi and planted the American Flag on the top of the hill, among them a young Arizonan named Ira Hayes; and

WHEREAS, this world famous event was recorded for all posterity and the photograph has become famous in American history, not only emblematic for the United States Marine Corps, but as a symbol of all Americans who fought for this Nation's freedom; and

WHEREAS, more United States Marines distinguished themselves by conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of their life and above the call of duty and earned the Congressional Medal of Honor on Iwo Jima than in any other battle in U.S. History.
