The DRA created section 1916A of Title XIX (42 U.S.C. 1396o-1) which permits states to impose higher than nominal copayments on certain populations over 100% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL). The AHCCCS Administration plans to move forward using this authority to change the copayment requirements for those members under the Transitional Medical Assistance (TMA) program with 100% or higher of the FPL and any other changes required to conform to 1916A of Title XIX.
