EXECUTIVE ORDERS, PROCLAMATIONS OF GENERAL APPLICABILITY, AND STATEMENTS ISSUED BY THE GOVERNOR PURSUANT TO A.R.S. § 41-1013(B)(3)

The Administrative Procedure Act (APA) requires the full-text publication of all Executive Orders and Proclamations of General Applicability issued by the Governor. In addition, the *Register* shall include each statement filed by the Governor in granting a commutation, pardon or reprieve, or stay or suspension of execution where a sentence of death is imposed. With the exception of egregious errors, content (including spelling, grammar, and punctuation) of these orders has been reproduced as submitted.

* SUDDEN INFANT DEATH SYNDROME AWARENESS MONTH *

WHEREAS, Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS), the sudden and unexpected death of apparently healthy babies, is one of the leading causes of death in Arizona for infants one month to one year of age. Nationally, SIDS claims the lives of between 2,000 and 3,000 babies each year, approximately one baby for every one thousand born; and

WHEREAS, the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development, the Maternal and Child Health Bureau, the American Academy of Pediatrics provide recommendations for safe sleep positions and environmental factors that may help reduce the risk for SIDS; and

WHEREAS, infants in Arizona continue to die from SIDS and caregivers are unaware of risk reduction practices, including placing babies on their backs to sleep, choosing safe bedding, keeping babies from overheating, choosing breastfeeding when possible and creating tobacco-free environments; and

WHEREAS, increasing public awareness among all Arizona parents and infant caregivers on the importance of creating safe sleep environments has a great potential for saving lives and sparing family the tragedy of an infant's death.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Janice K. Brewer, Governor of the State of Arizona, do hereby proclaim October 2010 as

in Arizona and urge citizens to practice SIDS risk reduction and safe sleep recommendations to reduce the risk of SIDS and other sleep related infant deaths.
