In order to conform to the Federal Occupational Safety and Health Standards as required by Section 18(c) of the Federal Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970, requiring state administered occupational safety and health programs to adopt standards that are at least as effective as those adopted by the U.S. Department of Labor, The Industrial Commission is amending R20-5-602, by incorporating by reference, amendments from 29 CFR 1910, as

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published in *Federal Register* 76 FR75782-75786, December 5, 2011 and became a final rule effective March 5, 2012.

This direct final rule revises the Acetylene Standard, by updating a reference in the standard, published by the Compressed Gas Association, a standards developing organization. This rule adopts the Compressed Gas Association most current references, CGA G-1, 2009, replacing CGA G-1 2003 reference.

The Industrial Commission is also amending R20-5-601 and R20-5-602, by incorporating by reference, amendments from 29 CFR 1910 and 29 CFR 1926 as published in the *Federal Register* 77 FR 17574 – 17896, March 26, 2012.

This final rule is modifying its Hazard Communication Standard to conform to the United Nation's Globally Harmonized System of classification and labeling of chemicals.
